Thank you for your interest in the 2024 PIN Summer Internship (PSI)! Open to undergraduate and graduate students from any higher education institution, the PSI offers students the opportunity to work in-person on impactful smart technology projects that are dedicated to creating livable and equitable communities. Interns will gain valuable experience working with local government, community, and non-profit leaders while receiving a summer living stipend of \$8,000* for the 12-week internship. *The summer living stipend is paid bi-weekly at a rate of \$16.66 an hour and is taxed as income.

Please complete the following application by February 11, 2024, to be considered for an internship position.

Note, interns selected for positions are required to live within the community they serve and work in person at the work site indicated on the individual job description. PSI interns will be responsible for the

Internship candidates must be:

- Enrolled and actively engaged in a higher education institution program with a graduation date no earlier than Spring 2024.
- Enrolled in less than half-time course load* during summer 2024.

- Free of obligations (other jobs or travel) that will conflict with the work hours listed on the job description(s) for positions you are applying.
- Living in or willing to temporarily relocate to a reasonable daily commuting distance away from the in-person work site listed on the job description.

*A half-time course load is defined for undergraduates at 0-5 credit hours and for graduate students 0-2 credit hours.
